

Napanee Generating Station Community Update – June 2016

Welcome to the Napanee Generating Station (NGS) Community Update! This newsletter will provide you with important project information, upcoming events, construction and community updates.

Construction at the Napanee Generating Station is approximately 30 per cent complete. The site, which is located on Loyalist Parkway, will continue to be busy throughout the summer.

Construction in motion

A busy construction site is about to get even busier as the NGS project heads towards the peak of activities later this year. To date, the following activities have occurred or are underway:

- Completed the installation of interconnections to the OPG Lennox Generating Station including water, wastewater and sanitary connections;
- Poured most of the major building and equipment foundations;
- Continued installation of underground electrical and piping installations;
- Started installation of major equipment including the Heat Recovery Steam Generators and combustion turbines;
- Started installing structural steel for the Administration, Combustion Turbine and Auxiliary Boiler/Water Treatment Buildings;
- Started installing the High Voltage Electrical switchyard;
- Received approximately 80 per cent of all of the required equipment for the project, with the rest expected to arrive by road, rail and barge in the upcoming months; and
- Preparing to start the installation of the steam turbine generator this summer.

Overall, construction is approximately 30 per cent complete and we have about 650 workers currently on site. As construction activities continue to ramp up, the peak construction workforce will increase to approximately 750 workers.

In the coming weeks, we will begin to landscape the site based on a design approved by members of our Architectural and Landscaping Advisory Committee. Work this year will include the planting of approximately 2,000 trees and thousands of shrubs on the berms on the south side of the site along Loyalist Parkway.

Community Update

Tracking traffic

In partnership with Lafarge, TransCanada has supported the installation of three speed radar signs to monitor vehicle traffic around the NGS site. The signs collect speed data that TransCanada then shares with the Ontario Provincial Police to help assess speed levels in the area. Two of the speed signs are located on Highway 33, both eastbound and westbound in the village of Bath. The third sign is located on County Road 8, just north of Southview Public School.

Building more than power plants

TransCanada has partnered with Habitat for Humanity Kingston and Frontenac, to build a house in Napanee for a local family. The Town of Greater Napanee recently agreed to donate a piece of property located in the eastern end of town. Several other organizations will be involved to see this project to fruition including: our NGS construction contractor Matrix NAC, the Quinte-St. Lawrence Building and Construction Trades Council, as well as community volunteers. Construction is currently planned to start late this summer. TransCanada is looking forward to working with the community on this project and advancing this exciting opportunity.



Upcoming Traffic Delays

Upcoming equipment deliveries will bring some temporary traffic delays or road closures on Highway 33 in both directions, between the Lafarge Bath Cement Plant and the NGS site (just east of Country Road 21), as the steam turbine generator is delivered to site. We anticipate these deliveries during the first couple weeks of June. Every effort will be made to minimize traffic disruption, including avoiding shipments during regular school bus hours. The equipment will be accompanied by police escorts in front and behind. Your safety is important to TransCanada, and we appreciate your cooperation and patience.

Investing in Napanee

As part of our commitment to invest in positive community initiatives, in September 2014, TransCanada and the Town of Greater Napanee signed a Community Host Agreement which will provide \$2 million in funding to the Town for community development projects over the next 20 years. On May 17, 2016 the Community Development Committee, set up under the terms of the Community Host Agreement, met with local charitable and not-for-profit organizations to make them aware of the granting criteria and advise how they can apply for funding. The Community Development Committee is responsible for distributing all funding for community projects and is made up of representatives from TransCanada and the Town of Greater Napanee.
